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## **Twenty-fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time**

15th September 2019 Psalter: Week 4

#### Where is your God?

After an age of wondering through the desert, the Israel arrives at Mount Sinai where God calls Moses up the mountain to receive the 10 Commandments. God has done great things for His people. He has freed them from slavery in Egypt, divided the Red Sea and even provided sustenance for them in the desert and yet, it seems their memories are very short. With Moses away, the people start to ask, "where is our God?" They almost instantly forget all that has happened and turn to themselves for an answer. The create a new idol in the form of a Golden Calf and quickly declare, "Here is your God, Israel."

Israel's situation is hardly unique. We too can suffer from "short memories", asking, "where is our God?" In moments of hardship, He can be hard to see as we forget how He is walking with us in the present. In times of happiness and self-sufficiency, God fades into the background as we enjoy the fruits of our labour. In short, we fail to recognise God in our lives and begin to answer the question by constructing our own "Golden Calves" of wealth, status and security, acclaiming with the Israelites, "Here is our God."

In the Gospel, Our Lord shares with us 3 parables explaining how dear each and every one of us is to God. We all suffer from "short memories", wandering from the right path and doing all kinds of things along the way. Sometimes we feel that we are not worthy of the Lord's forgiveness or that our sin is so big that we can't be forgiven. However, "God never tires of forgiving us, we are the ones who tire of seeking His mercy" (Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium, §3) So this week let us ask ourselves "where is our God?" Is our God wealth or status? Or is Our God waiting for you to encounter Him in prayer or experience His mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation?
