The Cappagh Padre Pio Prayer Group from Omagh, County Tyrone will be visiting St Teilo's Whitchurch with its relic of St. Padre Pio tomorrow. The relic is a glove that covered his stigmata. There will be Mass, Saint Padre Pio Novena prayers, Rosary and veneration of the relic. All are welcome.
